With the communion of Mary and all the saints who have gone before us and with those who work and pray for your Kingdom's glory, we give thanks to the Lord, now and forever. Amen.

A reading from the Gospel of Matthew

Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' Matthew 25: 34–36

Jesus specifically mentions care for prisoners, he does not say wrongly imprisoned or falsely imprisoned, but caring for all those in prison. Let us reflect on how we can do the same and acknowledge where we have not shown this care in the past.

Select a reading and reflect of what it is saying to you about you own faith. You can choose to read from the lectionary or a reading from your own bible reading pattern.

A time of reflection

Choose one or two of the following questions and using the passage of scripture reflect on what God might be saying to you

- How is my faith today? What paths am I following to deepen my love for Christ?
- Where do I see God working? Am I playing my part in God's mission to those whom society has neglected?
- When I think over the last few days, have I shared the love of Jesus Christ with anyone?
- What more does this teach me about God and His love for all creation?
- How does this passage renew me today in my body, mind and spirit?

<u>A time of prayer</u>

We offer prayers today for all those affected by imprisonment.

We ask that Lord God you would draw alongside and make your love known to those serving custodial sentences, those people on probation in the community, and those staff and volunteers who support and mentor them.

We pray for children who are living today with a parent in prison and other family members who have a loved one in prison. We pray that they would find comfort in you, solace in your Holy word and support in a community of believers.

We pray also for Pact, their staff and volunteers, who seek to serve all those affected by imprisonment both in prison and in the community.

In the name of Jesus Christ, we pray. Amen +
