Comic art is a good way to share your story in an exciting visual way. Use this resource to create a comic book of your own.




What you need

- Something to add colour





Get Started

How a comic book works



The pictures are in boxes and are called panels.

The narrator text is in rectangles at the top or bottom of the panel.



Speech is in bubbles, thought bubbles and sound effect shapes.



Top Tip

When you sketch your designs, leave space for the text.

Planning stage

The drawing should give people a taste of what is inside the comic.



