#### **Family Forum**

Stoke Heath are hosting three Family Forums this year. We have recruited family members to meet with Governors to discuss your feedback. Our Family Support Workers have been asking you to complete feedback forms. We then search for themes that arise and these will be discussed. The forum members are there to represent you and address your concerns.

#### First Family Forum - Thursday 18th April

Our Family Forum spoke on behalf of our 58 completed feedback forms The themes discussed were:

1. Purchasing food in the visits hall Tea and Coffee in the Visitors' Centre

2. Lack of consistency from prison staff regarding rules

3. Longer visit times

4. Punctuality to ensure visitors and prisoners are entering the hall at 2.15pm

Gov Robb has suggested many outcomes such as sourcing sandwiches to sell in the visit hall, revisiting policies and protocol with all staff to ensure consistency, possibility of moving visit times forward to be in line with prison movement etc.

As part of the Equalities team, Gov. Butler; Gov. Butcher and the Neurodiversity Support Manager are working with Governor Robb and the PACT Family team to listen to feedback from you and the prisoners on how we can improve visits. We are thinking about having a walkthrough experience using William the Bear as a 'social story' to help you and your families understand and be prepared for a different environment, as well as what we have to do for security to keep everyone safe and well for their special Visit. This might be pictures on the walls as well as some materials to touch and feel for people that are worried about a new place, change to their daily routine, or are very sensitive to noises, bright lights or lots of people. Sometimes these changes take a bit of time to finish to make sure we look at everyone's ideas to check they would work in this prison for different people. Our hope is that in our plans we find a way to make it as easy as possible for anyone to come and see their family and to have a good time. 🤊
